A General and Special **Election will be held for our city on Tuesday, November 4, 2025**, to elect three atlarge council members (four-year terms) and one at-large council member (two-year term). The following candidates have qualified to run for three at-large seats in the general election: Patrick Bussenius, Skipper Dahlstrom, Dick LoPresti, Bill Lyons and Chip McDaniel. The following candidates have qualified to run for one at-large seat in the special election: Bill Lacy and Gary Volino. Kathy Sanders was traveling and was unable to be here to qualify to run, but she will offer herself as a write-in candidate for the general election to fill a four-year term.

Advance in-person voting will be available in City Hall from 9 AM until 5 PM on the following dates: October 14-18, October 20-25 and October 27-31. On November 4 the polls will be open in City Hall from 7 AM until 7 PM. If there is a runoff, it will take place on December 2. If you need to register to vote in this election, you need to do that on or before October 6. We are still in need of a Spanish-speaking poll worker if you know of anyone who may be interested in helping. Please contact Leigh Threadgill who is our election superintendent and absentee ballot clerk. She can answer any questions about the election process.

BLHA is finalizing **plans to lower the lake** in 2026 to facilitate seawall and dock repairs as well as to do some spot de-silting. Starting on **Monday**, **January 5**, the lake will be lowered approximately six feet. Allowing two weeks to lower the lake, they are telling people to plan for six weeks of making repairs, mid-January through **Sunday**, **March 1**. Depending upon rainfall, we expect the lake to be at full pool by the end of April. Please contact BLHA if you need more details.

Someone is posing as the city to get folks to pay for variance applications. Several recent variance applicants received **phishing emails** asking for payment of a bogus invoice. Staff immediately notified VC3, the city's IT provider, who said these incidents are **exploiting open, transparent government**. If you'll recall, a few years back the city began posting agenda packets for city council and planning and zoning commission meetings on the city's website, which is where the fraudulent invoices derive their information. Staff plans to revert to posting the agenda without the additional attachments to avoid similar problems moving forward.
