My wife LeAnne and I have lived in Berkeley Lake for 24 years. For the last 12 of those years, I've been honored to serve on the Berkeley Lake City Council. I humbly ask for your continued support in the upcoming election.

Looking Forward: As a city, we will always face challenges. Two prominent issues confronting the city include (1) the perennial, essential need to manage stormwater and (2) the seemingly never-ending explosion in the deer population. I helped oversee the building of the beach pavilion and bathrooms and led the BLHA Board as we partnered with the city during the lowering of the lake and the planning to rebuild the dam. I also coordinate the city's flag and cross memorial display for the weeks around Memorial Day and Veterans' Day — (thanks to all the other neighbors who help with this!).

Education and Work: I grew up in Jackson, Mississippi and graduated from Georgia Tech in 1990. I've worked in the field of industrial automation for my entire career, starting as a co-op student while at Tech. To encourage middle and high school students to choose a scientific and/or technical education, I've volunteered with *FIRST* Robotics for many years. I'm President Emeritus, and still serving actively on the board of directors for the <u>state arm</u> of the international *FIRST* organization.
